

Relationships and Sexuality Education

Relationships and Sexuality Education in school offers students the opportunity to:

- Find out accurate, factual information about relationships, sex and sexuality;
- Ask questions and find help and support with anything they want to know;
- Discuss issues of relationships, sex and sexuality with staff and students;
- Talk to a staff member they trust in confidence about any aspect of relationships, sex or sexuality. If a student is at risk of being harmed in any way, staff will use our child protection policy to ensure the student is kept safe;
- Find out about good sources of help, information and support beyond school;
- Find out about personal rights and responsibilities to do with relationships, sex and sexuality;
- Make their views known about what school should provide in R&SEd.

The views of parents/guardians are very welcome on any aspect of Relationships and Sexuality Education.
